Trump removes U.S. from agreement to fight climate change

WASHINGTON, D.C. — President Donald Trump made a big announcement Thursday afternoon. He said he will remove the United States from an agreement. The agreement was between the United States and more than 100 other countries.

What Is Climate Change?

The agreement is about climate change. The planet is getting warmer. Most scientists think that the warming cannot be explained by nature alone.

Most of Earth's warming since the mid-1900s is from people. We have burned coal, oil and gas. We do this to heat houses and drive cars. It emits greenhouse gases. They trap heat in the air.

Scientists use models and math to guess how Earth will change. They think it will keep getting hotter for the next 100 years.

A Deal To Stop Warming Temperatures

Countries around the world got together to try to stop the Earth from warming so much. The countries would come up with rules for businesses to follow. They would make changes to the fuels people used.

This would not happen right away. It would take a long time. The deal was called the Paris climate agreement. More than 100 countries signed it.

In 2015, Barack Obama was the president of the United States. He signed the deal. When Trump was running to be president, he said he would leave the deal.

Republicans, Democrats Divided

Democrats and Republicans are the two main political groups in the United States. Trump is a Republican. Obama is a Democrat. Many Republicans did not like the Paris agreement. They thought it would hurt businesses.

Some Republicans think it would cost too much money to make these changes. Many businesses use oil and coal. The fuels power factories to make things. Trump said the Paris deal would be bad for American workers. Many of these workers voted for him.

Businesses Supported The Climate Agreement

Still, some businesses liked the Paris agreement. Even some oil companies supported it. These included ExxonMobil and BP. Many of these oil companies have accepted new rules to stop greenhouse gasses. They have been changing their businesses for years.

The United States cannot leave the agreement right away. It may take years. Still, Trump's choice could affect other countries sooner.

Most countries wanted the United States to stay with the Paris agreement. Trump met with leaders in Europe last week. Many of them tried to convince him not to leave the agreement.

The United States creates a lot of the world's greenhouse gases. It releases the second most greenhouse gases of any country in the world.
